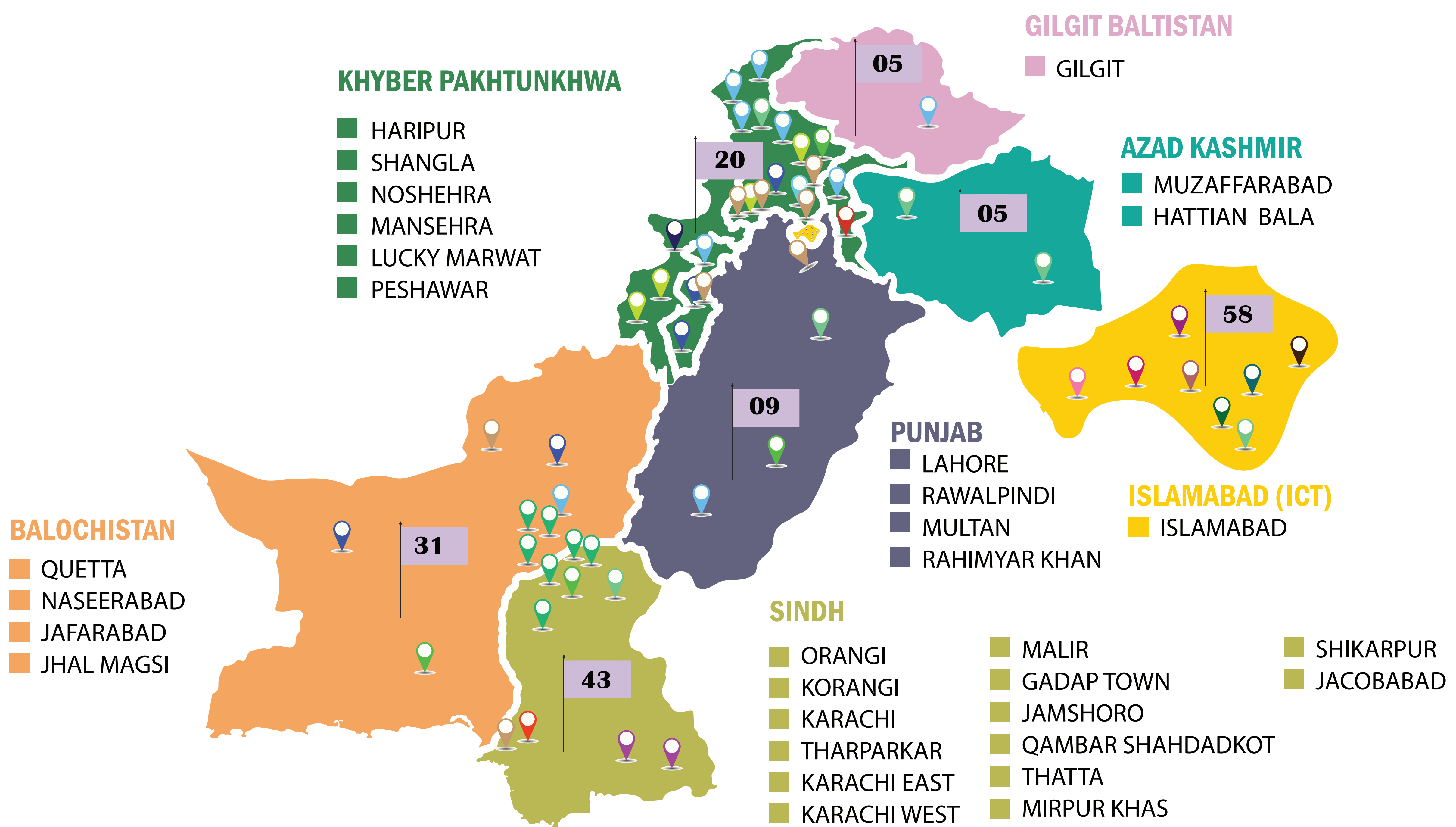
PAGE'S IMPACTFUL INTERVENTIONS ACROSS PAKISTAN

PAGE has secured a grant from the UNIFOR Social Justice Fund for our Stars Schools in Tharparkar.

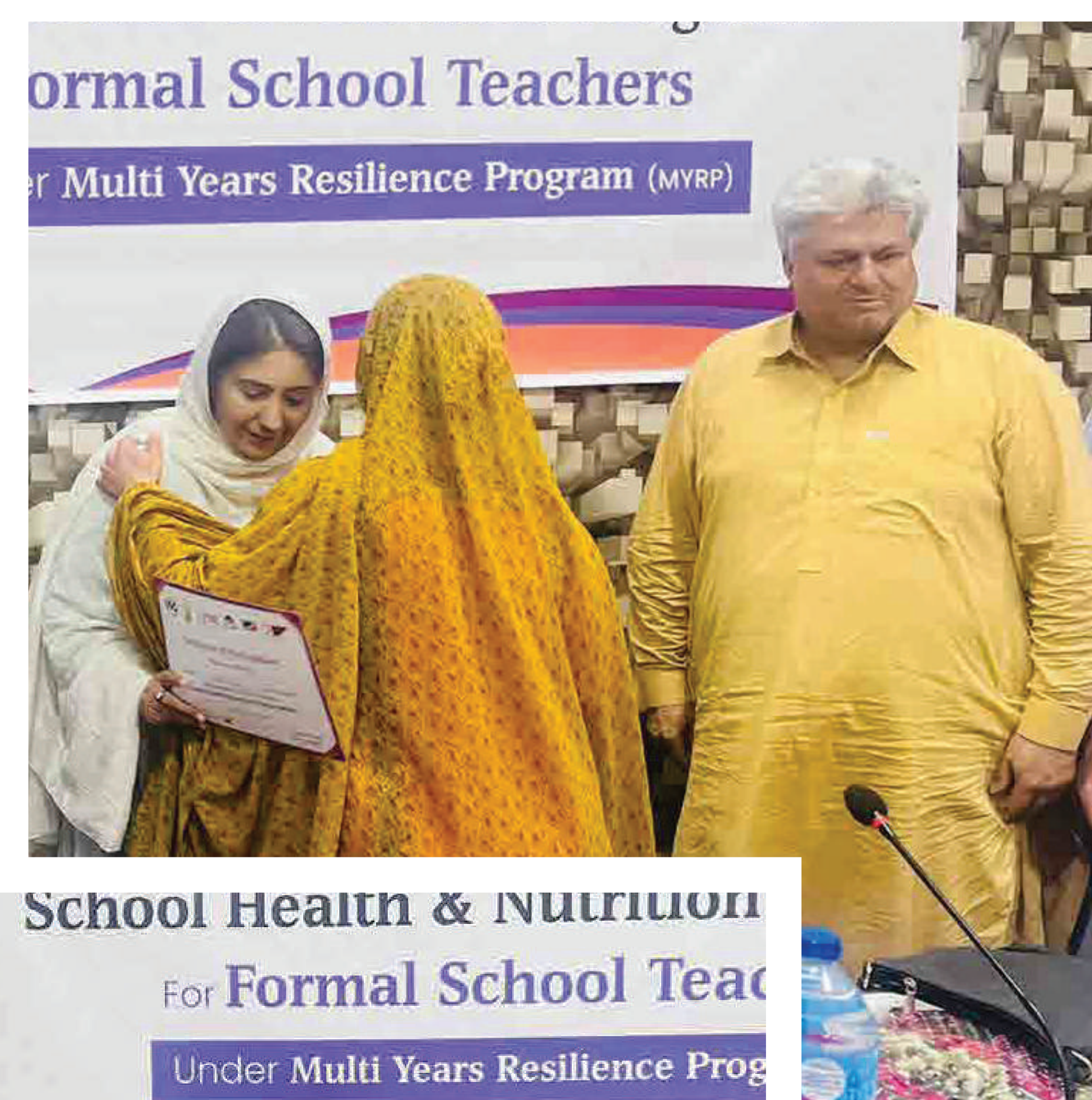

MULTI-YEAR RESILIENCE PROGRAM (MYRP)



- Conducted a 3-day Capacity Building Session on School Health & Nutrition Program (SHNP) in Peshawar, KPK for 34 formal school teachers, including 20 females.
- Conducted a 3-day Capacity Building Session on School Health & Nutrition Program (SHNP) in Quetta, Balochistan for 15 formal school teachers, including 9 females.
- Held a 1-day refresher on Social Inclusion and Gender (SIG) with consortium partners in Balochistan for gender focal persons of grantees and sub-grantees.
- Distributed dry food supplies to ECE, CLP, and pre-primary students in Balochistan, covering 16 ECE centers, 24 CLP centers, and 48 formal schools in districts Quetta and Chaghi.
- PAGE hosted a free webinar on the topic of "Addressing School-Related Gender-Based Violence (SRGBV) in Pakistan: Exploring Causes, Tools, and Impacts" covering 20 organizations from all over Pakistan.

ACTION FOR GENDER EQUITY & SOCIO-ECONOMIC UPLIFT OF DISPLACED AFGHAN WOMEN AND GIRLS



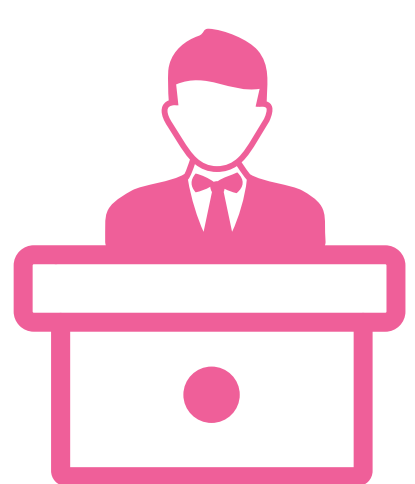
- Graduates of WPHF bootcamp program phase-I showcased their products in 3 exhibitions—1 in Rawalpindi and 2 in Quetta, expanding their networks and reaching a broader customer base.
- One day follow-up and mentorship session with PAGE and NOVE staff in Islamabad, supported by the WPHF Peer Learning Grant to streamline the organizational roadmaps developed during our 3-day training conducted in May.
- Completed assessments for Package B at all targeted NFS, with 483 students from 15 NFS participating and being promoted after achieving commendable scores.
- Conducted feedback sessions with parents, with 87% expressing satisfaction with PAGE's performance and their children's growth.
- Completed three rounds, significantly boosting the language skills and cultural understanding of 611 girls and women (364 under 18 and 247 over 18), with 96% reporting high levels of satisfaction and increased confidence.
- Launched the second round of the marketing boot camp in March, enrolling approximately 165 women and girls. Participants have completed the first phase of vocational training and are now advancing to the second phase focusing on Digital Marketing and Online Marketing.
- Designed and implemented SDPs at all 15 NFS, with active engagement from the VEC and community to improve the school environment effectively



OUT-OF-SCHOOL CHILDREN PROJECT IN KARACHI



- Engaged students in a fun and interactive Mango Party event.
- Students celebrated Watermelon Day by making beautiful crafts and learning about the days of the week through drawing and coloring activities.
- Students participated in extracurricular activities where they made pineapple crafts from paper and engaged in reading sessions to enhance their communication skills and build confidence.
- Conducted a 5-day training session for teachers in collaboration with The World NGO.
- Organized summer vocabulary activities to enhance students' language skills.

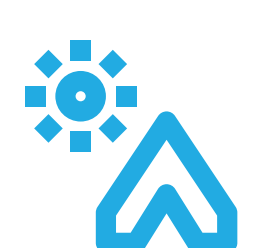

Enrollment, Retention and Progression (ERP) of Out of school children (OOSC) in ICT



- Under Summer Festa Program in collaboration with Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training, our 21 volunteers Delivered 24 engaging sessions to 881 government school students expanding the benefits to 2000+ beneficiaries.
- Hosted a Play-Based Activity for 20 children (10 females, 10 males) to support their Emotional Well-Being in collaboration with Pakistan Red Crescent and International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC).

EDUCATION PROJECT FOR FLOOD-AFFECTED COMMUNITIES IN BALOCHISTAN AND SINDH: HIGHLIGHTS



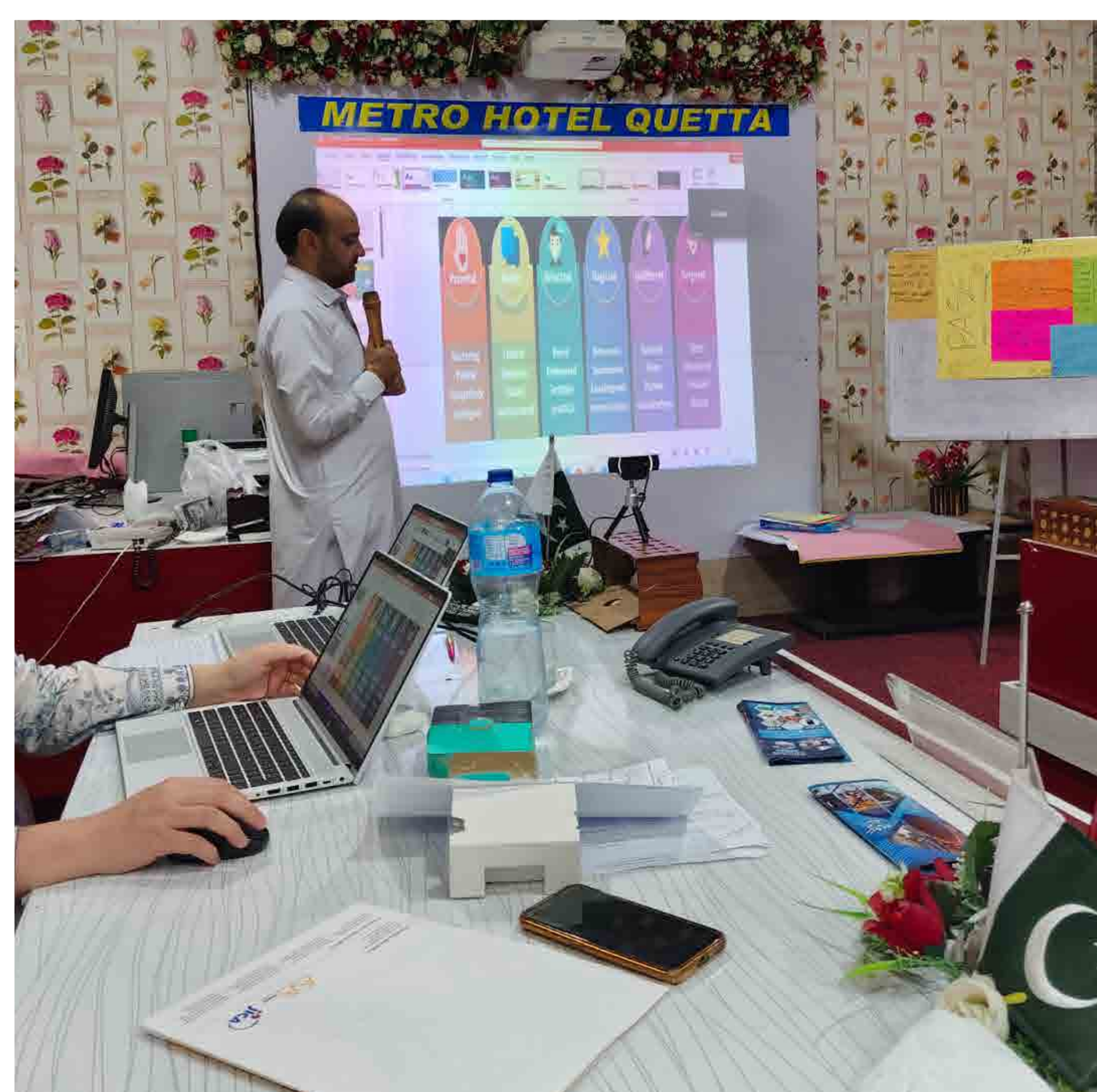
- Four-day capacity building event for 20 educators (16 male, 4 female) in Quetta covering the Topics of Package B, MH&PSS, climate change, and adaptability.
- Distribution of essential school supplies like whiteboards with stands and attendance registers in 36 schools across Sindh and Balochistan.
- Distribution of school bags, notebooks, and stationery pouches to 1300 learners in seven districts of Sindh and Balochistan.
- Supplied sports kits, including cricket bats, badminton rackets, footballs, and ludo sets, to 36 NFS to encourage extracurricular activities.
- Conducted health and hygiene education sessions in schools to promote better health practices among students.



EDUCATION PROJECT IN SWAT (IN COLLABORATION WITH MALALA FUND)



- Conducted a session in Rang Mohallah Swat for 15 Mothers, on early child marriages, importance of girls' education, and health and hygiene, facilitated by PAGE Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Officer.
- Handed over dignity kits to 28 adolescent girls in Swat to promote hygiene.
- Provided shoes and uniforms to 28 students under the PAGE scholarship program to support their educational journey.
